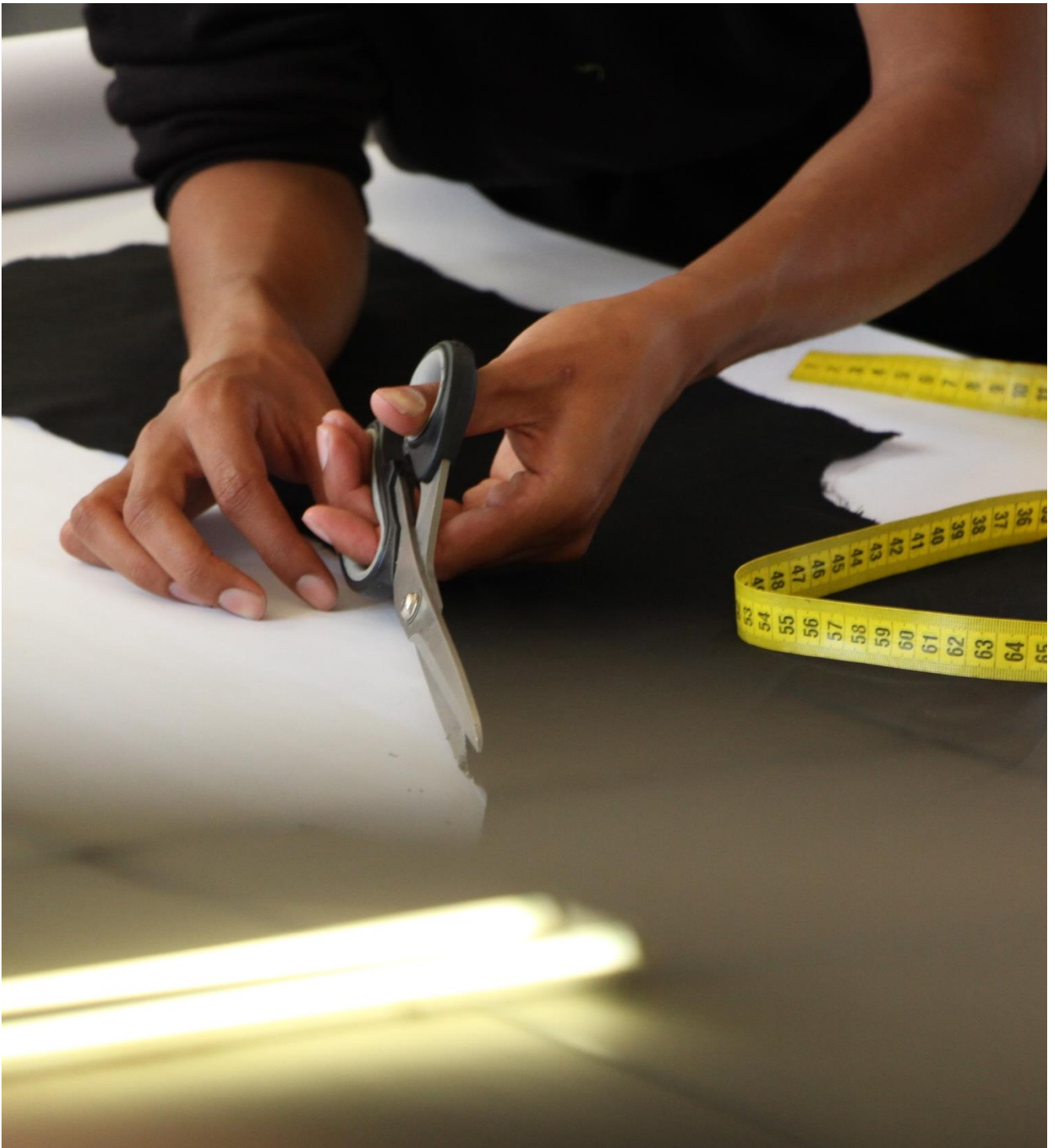


NORTH WEST SCHOOL OF DESIGN

PART TIME FASHION DESIGN 2022





DESCRIPTION

During this very popular course students get taught Fashion Design on a part- time basis. Various modules will be completed in this course namely;

Part Time Sewing:

Module will cover all aspects of sewing, whereby students will have to produce sewing samples, tracing of a commercial pattern and make a basic skirt and blouse.

Part Time Pattern Design:

Module will assist student in drafting 37 block patterns for women, men and children, by using the award winning, X!Act Design Patternmaker™ instrument.

Design Foundations:

In this module, students will be trained in Basic Textile Technology, Basic Garment Illustration, Design Principles, and Costings and pricing techniques.

Corset Design:

This module explores the creativity of designing and making an corset using the X!Act Design Patternmaker™ instrument.

Showcase:

This module focusses on creating a design to fit a model, whereby one cocktail wear garment will be made for the Platinum Fashion Festival. Students can then decide if they wish to showcase their garment.

Fittings and alterations on this will be relayed to the students, so that the necessary changes can be made.

WHEN?

All classes are presented on **Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 17:30 – 19:00** from the 15th of February to 29 November 2022.

Please ensure to be at class at 17:15, should you be late the lecturer should be informed by Whatsapp

The Part Time Fashion class is split into five (5) modules, namely:

- Part Time Sewing
- Part Time Pattern Design
- Design Foundations
- Showcase
- Corset Design

Should classes fall on a public holiday, the lecturer will inform students accordingly of changes in their class schedule. Term breaks will also be discussed, as there will be no classes during school term breaks.

WHAT DO YOU NEED

To Study Part-Time Fashion,

As this is a non-credit bearing course, there are no strict requirements to study Part Time Fashion. Although the ability to read and write and basic math skills are important factors that the prospective student must possess. The minimum age to register is 17 years with the assistance of a Guardian or Parent in registering.

For all practical Modules, you are required to bring a notebook, pen, pencil and a ruler.

- For **Basic Sewing** (own fabric and sewing machine) machine can be rented from NWSD. Enquire when registering for course.
- For **Pattern Design module** you will need Pattern Paper (which can be ordered from NWSD), paper scissor, curving ruler (optional), 1m ruler (optional), paper glue, highlighters, eraser and tracing wheel (Provided in Basic Sewing kit).
- For **Design Foundations** you must bring basic stationery, coloured pencils, black fineliner, grey pencils, eraser and a sharpener. Should any other stationery be needed by you, the lecturer will inform you in accordance.
- For the **Corset Design** module, you will be required to bring your own fabric, interlining (available from NWSD), sewing machine, boning, zip and *Pattern Design equipment* and *Sewing module Kit* that you have received from NWSD. The lecturer will advise of to which fabric, boning, zips and interlining must be used by you.
- For your **Showcase** module, you will be required to bring material that you are going to use for your design for the Platinum Fashion Festival as well as your sewing machine, for the construction of the garment for the PFF. *Patternmaking Kit* and *Sewing Kit* (that you have received from NWSD) must also be brought to class.

WHAT WE PROVIDE

- For **Basic Sewing** NWSD Provides a *Sewing Kit* which NWSD provides which includes: 1 x open ended zip, 1 x fabric marking pencil, 1 x unpicker, 1 x measuring tape, 1 x black thread (roll), 1 x tracing wheel, 1 x fabric scissors, 1 x thread scissors and 1 x hook and eye pair.
- For **Pattern Design module** NWSD provides a *Pattern Maker kit* which includes the following; 1 x Patternmaker, 1 x Pattern Engineering Manual, 1 x X!Act Design Patternmaker Manual, 2 x Patternmaker DVD's
- In the **Design Foundation** module you will receive the following books, 1 x Design Principles book, 1 x Design your Price costing manual, 1 x Garment Illustration manual, 1 x Textile Technology Manual.
- In the **Corset Design** you will also receive, The Modern Corsetiere Book.

HOW DO I PAY?

Short Courses

Here at North West School of Design, our short courses are a combination of evening classes and Saturday workshops ranging from one –day workshops to two month part-time courses.

In the efforts to make our short course more affordable, the NWSD short courses are offered as non-credit bearing courses, as these courses are not unit standard based. Student therefore receive a non-credit bearing certificate after completing the short course.

What Does It Mean If My Course Is Non-Accredited?

Are you interested in studying a non-accredited course, but not sure whether it is worth the time and money? Many people are still under the impression that a non-accredited course has no value. This is not true. Non-accredited courses are great for learning a new skillset or building on your existing proficiencies. What's more, they are shorter in duration, which means that you can gain a new skill set in as little as six months.

What you need to know about non-accredited courses
