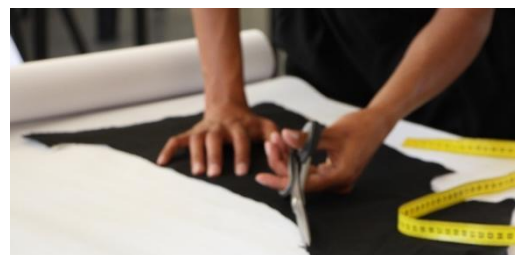


NORTH WEST SCHOOL OF DESIGN

Payments for class fees and other fees can be paid directly into the banking account of North West School of Design via EFT.

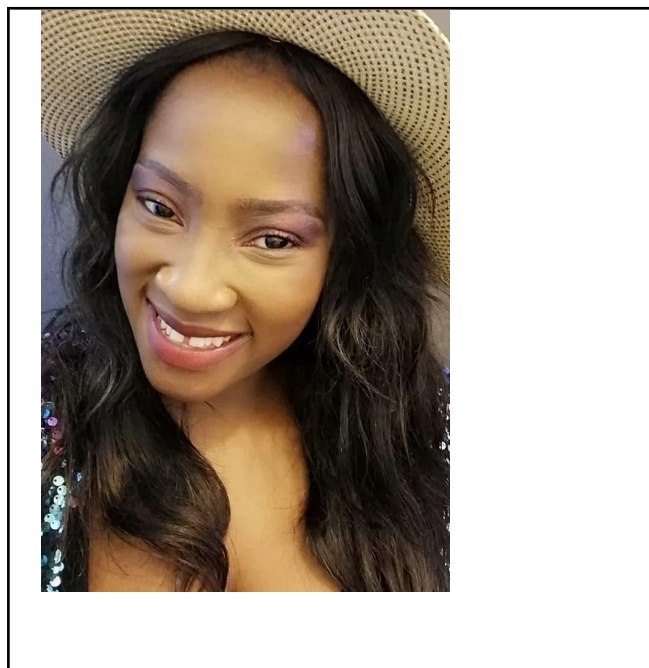
Alternatively, cash can be paid and NWSD will issue a receipt for students.

Short Courses

Here at North West School of Design, our short courses are a combination of evening classes and Saturday workshops ranging from one-day workshops to nine-month part-time courses.

In the efforts to make our short course more affordable, the NWSD short courses are offered as non-credit bearing courses, as these courses are not unit standard based. Student therefore receive a non-credit bearing certificate after completing the short course.

What Does It Mean If My Course Is Non-Accredited?

Are you interested in studying a non-accredited course, but not sure whether it is worth the time and money? Many people are still under the impression that a non-accredited course has no value. This is not true. Non-accredited courses are great for learning a new skillset or building on your existing proficiencies.
